Thanksgiving

Thanksgiving Day is a national holiday celebrated as a day of giving thanks for the blessing of the harvest of the preceding year. It is celebrated on the fourth Thursday of November in the United States. Several other places around the world observe similar celebrations. As President of the United States, George Washington proclaimed the first nation-wide thanksgiving celebration in America marking November 26, 1789, "as a day of public thanksgiving...". Abraham Lincoln made it a National Holiday in 1863. In 1941 Congress declared the 4th Thursday in November as Thanksgiving.

A group of people left England in 1620 aboard the ship the Mayflower. They were looking for a new land for freedom. We know them as The Pilgrim's. The first thanksgiving feast in 1621 occurred sometime between September 21 and November 1. The harvest festivals gave thanks for plentiful crops because that year the Pilgrim's fall harvest was very successful and plentiful after a period of drought. There was corn, fruits, vegetables, along with fish which was packed in salt, and meat that was smoke cured over fires. The Governor proclaimed a day of thanksgiving that was to be shared by all the colonists and the neighboring Native American Indians.

It lasted three days and included 50 surviving pilgrims and approximately 90 Wampanoag Indians, including Chief Massasoit. Their menu differed from modern Thanksgiving dinners and included berries, shellfish, boiled pumpkin, and deer.



World's Largest Turkey
